

Chiropractic Care

In 2016, HealthNet patients reported chronic pain from work as their number one medical diagnosis. In response, HealthNet of Rock County began its Chiropractic Care program to provide an opportunity for uninsured community members to have access to a chiropractor when necessary. Since the launch of this program, we have had the assistance of four chiropractors helping us treat pain in hundreds of patients on an annual basis.



Why it matters in Rock County?

- Many Rock County residents work labor-intensive jobs in a factory or agricultural setting. Immediate pain relief is crucial to ensure employees can remain productive without delaying care.
- More opportunities for chiropractic care can reduce the community's reliance on opiates. The Rock County Health Needs Assessment ranked drug abuse related to pain or opiates as its top concern in 2017.

In our current space, HealthNet of Rock County is only able to host chiropractic care days when there are no doctors around due to the workflow of nurses and physicians in our small work space. This limits the ability of chiropractors to volunteer their time in our medical clinic. In HealthNet's new facility, chiropractic care will still remain a staple of treatment with a new, customized chiropractic room. Due to the expanded waiting room and clinic at 113 S. Franklin Street, HealthNet of Rock County can also have more chiropractors volunteer at various points of the week to help patients in pain.
