HealthNet of Rock County opened in 1994 as a 501(c) 3 non-profit organization after a needs assessment completed by the Salvation Army in 1993 identified a lack of affordable health care as one of the major problems of Rock County.



Why it matters in Rock County?

- Rock County ranks 62 out of 72 total Wisconsin counties for overall County Health rankings.
- Currently, there are 15,500 uninsured Rock County residents.

HealthNet, Rock County's only free & charitable clinic, is available to all uninsured and underinsured Rock County residents living at or below 250% of the Federal Poverty Level. Patients receive comprehensive healthcare, including programs that promote health, early diagnosis and prevention of disease. Through extensive case management, our patients' health is monitored through quality metrics. This ensures that their health is improving and our services are effective. Volunteer specialists prescribe and provide over \$1.5 million worth of medications annually from HealthNet's own pharmacy. In addition, we provide:
